7/2/2014	washed off bank	too close to shore	near miss	Russel glacier, Kanger	researchers	2 researchers were working at the Russel Glacier. They were collecting samples in the river that runs along the glacier on the bank and had just finished sampling, walked to the shore and packed their gear. While packing, a portion of the glacier calved and crashed into the river feet away from them, causing a "tsunami" wave that dragged both researchers down river approximately 10'. They were both submerged and banged up, scrapes and bruises. They both were able to get to the shore, gather the equipment, and return to town.
9/12/2014	broken window	vehicle speed, loose rocks	near miss	Dalton Hwy Ak	4 researchers	Researchers were traveling south and a truck traveling north threw a rock that went through the driver's window that was open a crack. The rock smashed the back window from the inside. One of the PIs on the project was in the passenger seat and 2 others were in the back. No one was hurt! Thankfully!
10/8/2014	snowmobile through the ice	thin ice	near miss	Barrow, AK	researcher	Researcher was towing a Zodiac behind the snowmobile when he went through the ice on a lake. Snowmobile sank about 3 feet. Researcher was wearing chest waders, float coat and was unhurt and able to crawl out onto the ice and then to shore (about 30 feet). UMIAQ recovered the snowmobile later that day.
